



### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**

L: Gathering around the table as we celebrate new life borning, we remember so many stories shared around tables; tables where bread is broken and cup is poured out, where families gather and generations share, where stories are remembered, refined, reshaped.

# (The Congregation is invited to sing in response) C: Gloria, gloria, in excelsis deo! Gloria, gloria, alleluia, alleluia!

L: Gathering around the table on this holy night, we remember the story of the sacred daring to share our life, the story of the holy donning human flesh and dwelling among us, a story that is at once both ethereal and earthly. The story of how this baby, Christ, Emmanuel grew and shared a meal—In the night in which he was betrayed our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.' Again, after supper he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.'

### C: Gloria, gloria, in excelsis deo! Gloria, gloria, alleluia, alleluia!

L: Gathering around the table on this Christmas night, we break the bread and remember the paradox that it is in our brokenness that we become whole; we fill this cup and remember the abundance discovered in each new sharing of our sacred stories.

### C: Gloria, gloria, in excelsis deo! Gloria, gloria, alleluia, alleluia!

L: Together, around the table, we pray: Come, holy Spirit, come. Bless this bread and bless this fruit of the vine. Bless all of us in our eating and drinking that our eyes might be opened, that we might recognize the Spirit rising in our midst indeed, in one another. Come, holy Spirit, come.

L: And just as we remember the story of the Christ child around the table—we together remember and sing the prayer he gifted to us:

ALL: Our Father in heaven, all praise to Your name! Your kingdom among us, your will done the same By mortals and angels, Come, Lord, reign alone; Oh hear us and bless us from heaven's high throne.

The bread that we yearn for provide us each day; As we forgive others, our sins take away; In times of temptation, to lead us be near; From evil deliver Your children most dear.

For Yours is the kingdom; o'er all things Your reign. And Yours is the power; all things You maintain. To You be the glory, resounding again from all of creation, forever! Amen.

At Mt. Zion all are welcome to share in Christ's meal. 
C: So tonight we share God's light, for God's love just could not stay home. Amen.




