P: and a king appearing when we least expect...as once they did in Eden,



(Christ candle is lit.)



The communion liturgy will be sung to the tune of "What Child is This." Please join in this liturgy as we prepare for the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Today we are communing by intinction which is a fancy church word for dipping your bread into the grape juice cup. If you have a gluten allergy please let us know and we can give you elements uncontaminated by gluten. If you are uncomfortable coming forward and would like communion brought to you in your seat, also have a welcome team member or someone gathered here with you let me know and we will bring communion to you at the end.

C: And they offered him their treasured gifts when the time had fully come.



ALL: And with joy we join in praise!


