(Fourth advent candle is lit.)



P: And holding all things in his hands and heart—Christ comes—and with bold proclamation the angels remind us that God is here!


C: So tonight we share God's light. Amen.

C: to share the Love of the season with the world, to be agents of Peace in times of trouble, to sing songs of deep and abiding Joy.


