L: And if God meets us in all those places,


C: then surely God meets us everywhere— at the water's edge, at the start of something new, after the baptism, and before the call.



L: God give us a deep love for you, that we might see your love at work in this world, and that we might go and do likewise. God in your mercy,


C: Hear our prayer.
