L: And if God meets us in all those places,


C: then surely God meets us everywhere— at the water's edge, at the start of something new, after the baptism, and before the call.

L: Together let us pray,



AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

L: Let us affirm our beliefs this day—beliefs that allow room for the lost, the found, and everything in between.

C: We believe in a seeking God, a with-us and before-us God, a chasing-after-us God. We believe that no matter where we wander or what mountains we climb, this God— the God who walked the streets of Jerusalem, shook hands with lepers, patted children on the head, and told stories of love— is always close at hand. So on the good days and the hard days, on the mountains and in the valleys, we believe that we are always being found. Thanks be to God for a love like that. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE & THE LORD'S PRAYER

L: As we journey through this Lenten season, we remember that our God is a loving Shepherd, always seeking the lost, calling the wandering, and rejoicing when even one soul returns to Him. With hearts open to His mercy, let us bring our prayers before Him.

L: You never stop searching for those who are lost—those weighed down by sin, those who have drifted from faith, and those who do not yet know Your saving love. In this season of repentance, draw them back to You. Break through the barriers of shame and doubt, and remind them that no one is beyond Your grace. God in your mercy.

C: Hear our prayer.

L: You have called us into Your fold and claimed us as Your own. Keep us from growing complacent in our faith. Strengthen us in our walk with You, and give us hearts that rejoice, not resent, when others find their way home. Teach us to be a people of grace, welcoming all who seek You. God in your mercy.

C: Hear our prayer.

L: Loving God, for those who feel caught between doubt and belief, for those who are searching but unsure, and for those struggling to trust You—be their guiding light. In this season of Lent, give them the courage to take steps toward You, knowing that You are already running to meet them. God in your mercy.

C: Hear our prayer.

L: God of the lost and weary, You have entrusted Your Church with the mission of reflecting Your love to the world. Help us to be faithful in seeking the lost, patient in walking alongside the wandering, and joyful in welcoming home the repentant. Make our congregations places of refuge and renewal, where all can encounter Your grace. God in your mercy.

C: Hear our prayer.

L: In this season of reflection and repentance, search our hearts. Show us where we, too, have strayed. Help us to turn back to You with humility and trust. Shape us into people who live out Your mercy, not only in word, but in action. God in your mercy. **C: Hear our prayer.**

L: Merciful God, You rejoice when even one lost soul is found. You call us to turn from our own wandering and to celebrate Your boundless grace. As we continue our Lenten journey, keep our eyes fixed on You, the Shepherd of our souls. We offer these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ, who came to seek and save the lost.


C: Amen.

L: Now may our voices join with all of God's children in praying the words that he taught us,


