## RESURRECTION PRAYERS<sup>2</sup>

P: Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

**C: “Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia”**

P: God of the empty tomb and the rolled away stone, on this Easter morning, we come as we are—some of us filled with hallelujahs, some of us still wrapped in grave clothes of grief. So we lift to you our prayers for the world and for ourselves, trusting that you meet us in the in-between. For those staring into the shadows of this world—those who see only the pain, the violence, the loss, who are caught in the ache of death and can’t imagine life beyond it—Christ, risen One,

**C: Shine your light and hold them close.**

P: For those whose nations are torn by war, whose homes are wrecked by human made conflict or shaken by the earth itself—those whose daily lives are marked by fear, famine, or fire—God of peace and restoration,

**C: Be near to them. Be mercy in the rubble and breath in the chaos.**

P: For those who cannot even picture the stone being rolled away—who are stuck in sorrow, who have stopped hoping for change, who have buried their dreams and can’t find the strength to dig them up again—God of resurrection,

**C: Whisper life into the silence and stir the soil of their hearts.**

P: For all who are walking between the tomb and the garden, between despair and belief, between Friday’s cry and Sunday’s song—be gentle with us. Be patient. And keep showing up in unexpected ways.

**C: Walk with us in the waiting.**

P: We give you thanks today for the signs of hope that pull us toward joy—for springtime and sunrises, for laughter that returns uninvited, for friends who stay when grief lingers, and most of all, for the wild, holy news that Jesus Christ is alive.

**C: We give you thanks that Christ is risen. Hope is real. Love is stronger than death.**

P: And so, even when the world feels heavy, we dare to sing hallelujah. Even when joy feels like a risk, we choose it anyway. Because Easter isn’t just a day— it’s a promise.

**ALL: New life is possible. The stone has been rolled away. Alleluia and Amen.**
