## TIME OF CONFESSION

P: Holy God of light and shadow,

**C: we confess that we do not always follow the glimmers You place before us. Sometimes we shrink back into familiar darkness, afraid of what Your light might reveal. Sometimes we cling to our own plans and expectations, like Herod grasping for control, rather than trusting the way You lead. When Your light stretches beyond our boundaries, we confess how quickly we draw lines. When You call us to wonder and discovery, we confess how often we choose certainty instead. Shine on the hidden corners of our hearts, O God. Reveal what needs healing. Lift what is heavy. Guide us, once again, by the star of Your mercy.**

P: Hear the good news: The same God who guided travelers by starlight now guides us by grace. No darkness is too deep, no fear too strong, no distance too great for the Light of Christ to reach you. In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven, renewed, and freed to follow the light that reveals life.

## **PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE & THE LORD'S PRAYER**

P: Let us gather our hearts now in prayer Holy God, You shine Your light into our darkest streets, revealing hope where we thought hope had ended, guiding us toward places we never expected to go. On this Epiphany morning, we lift our prayers to You—trusting that Your light is stronger than any shadow.

P: We pray for our children and youth—for all who are growing, learning, questioning, and discovering what it means to follow Your light. Guide them with curiosity and courage. Let Your hope be born again in their hearts.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: We pray for all who, like the Wise Men, are searching for direction—those facing big decisions, those beginning new chapters, those longing for purpose or clarity in the year ahead. Let Your light fall gently before them—one step at a time, enough for the moment, enough to follow.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: And we pray for ourselves—that the Star Word resting in our hands or pockets would become a holy companion this year. Help us notice its invitations, listen without fear, and trust that Your Spirit will reveal its meaning in Your perfect time.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: Holy God, Your light breaks into our lives not only with healing but with joy. We give thanks for celebrations, milestones, answered prayers, new beginnings, and the quiet blessings that carry us through our days. We lift now the joys of our community...

*(Pause for the congregation to lift joys aloud.)*

P: Thank you for the light these joys bring.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: We pray for Your church throughout the world—for every community seeking to follow Your star of justice, every congregation listening for Your guidance, and especially for this beloved community at Mt. Zion. Where we are weary, strengthen us. Where we are uncertain, guide us. Where we are divided, unite us in Your love.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

\*Those for whom it is comfortable, please rise.

P: We pray for our world—a world still caught between fear and wonder, between grasping for control and longing for peace. Shine Your light on leaders and nations, on places torn by violence or war, on communities hungry for safety, stability, and dignity. Lead us toward paths where justice and mercy meet.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: We pray for those who journey through shadows—those who are ill, recovering, grieving, or overwhelmed; those living with depression or anxiety; those whose bodies or spirits are in need of healing. And we pray for all whose hearts are heavy today—for burdens we carry quietly, for worries spoken and unspoken, for those situations that feel too big for us but never too big for You. We lift now the concerns of our community...

*(Pause for spoken concerns.)*

P: Give us light when we feel discouraged and filled with grief.

**C: God of revelation, shine Your light on us.**

P: God of Hope, gather all our prayers—spoken and silent—and kindle them into light. Help us to trust that even now, your dawn is breaking. Through Christ, the Light of the World, we pray, so together we join in the prayer Christ has taught us..

**ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.**
