CALL TO CONFESSION

L: Trusting in God's mercy, let us come with honesty before the One who knows our limits and meets us with compassion.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

C: Merciful God, we confess that we often try to carry more than we were meant to bear. We tell ourselves we must do it all, fix it all, hold it all together. P: Hear the good news. God does not meet us with disappointment, but with care. God does not shame our limits, but honors them. God does not ask us to carry the burden alone. In Christ, you are forgiven, In Christ, we all are forgiven, freed from what was never ours to hold, and invited into shared life and shared leadership.
